## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

JANUARY 14TH was inspired by my parent's 30+ year marriage. They were best friends who had journeyed through heaven and hell together. To say they were in love would be an understatement. They were soulmates. The only time I saw my father cry was when my mother passed away in 2008.

January 14th was their wedding anniversary.

Making a film in commemoration of their life together began in 2018. The script had gone through several incarnations before I settled on the version audiences are seeing today. The I4-minute film was shot over two days in Los Angeles with a small, but talented crew. The cast was made up of local actors who we selected through a meticulous and rigorous audition process. Chemistry between all the actors, above any previous experience, was what we were looking for. The budget was small, but we focused on capturing the soul of the story despite the limitations.

In essence, **JANUARY 14TH** is an exploration of the day-in-the-life of a young couple on their third-year anniversary and how they process a bittersweet reality.





## LA'CHRIS JORDAN

WRITER / DIRECTOR / EXEC. PRODUCER

LA'CHRIS JORDAN is an award-winning playwright, screenwriter and filmmaker who has received over 60+ awards, grants and honors for her writing. Recently, she was a grant development winner at the Stowe Story Labs and a finalist for the SAGindie Fellowship for her feature **ROSES IN THE WATER**. She was a winner in the Script Lab's Screenplay Contest for her historical pilot **PINEY RIDGE** which was also a Second Rounder at the Austin Film Festival, a finalist for the WeScreenplay Diverse Voices Fellowship, and a semifinalist for the Sundance Episodic Lab and the MACRO Episodic Lab powered by the Black List.

In 2019, La'Chris made her directorial debut with **JANUARY I4TH** which won Best Short and Best Director at the Top Indie Film Awards. The short is currently on the film festival circuit, gaining acceptance at prestigious festivals across the country such as the San Francisco Black Film Festival, Pan African Film Festival, Miami Independent Film Festival and Indie Short Fest. La'Chris is currently in pre-production for her second short film **THE RIDGE** which was a semifinalist in the Cinequest Screenwriting Competition.
















## TONI BULLOCK



## BRIAN ISOM

#### DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

BRIAN ISOM moved to Los Angeles from Gadsden, Alabama in 2011. He received his Bachelor's degree in Cinematography from Columbia College Hollywood in Tarzana, CA. He proceeded to work in showbiz as soon as he moved to the West Coast. Brian's first job was playing the role as a bailiff on "We the People" with Gloria Allred which is a syndicated court show where he was nominated for a Daytime Emmy Award. Shortly after that, he began working behind the scenes as a camera operator as well as a becoming a stage manager on shows ranging from sitcoms to daytime reality.

Brian is passionate about working in the entertainment industry and continues to work creatively with others who are equally passionate. In addition to that, he also served 16 years in the military as a staff sergeant working in Multi-Media Illustration, Infrastructure Rebuilding as well as an Instructor. In his spare time, Brian spends his time volunteering at Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Los Angeles where he shares his experience with young African-American males.









## Q&A WITH BRIAN ISOM

DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

## Q: What type of camera and lenses did you use for January 14<sup>th</sup>? Why?

A: The camera I chose for JANUARY I4<sup>TH</sup> was the Sony A7RII – lenses used were XEEN primes 24mm, 35mm, 85mm. The reason for the camera and lens choice was that the Sony A series are just as competitive as other cameras in its class. The camera shoots 8-bit and has S-log for toning down highlights such as windows and anything that would appear overexposed in native format. When using S-Log to shoot, performing grading in the post-production process will allow you to create image effects matching each scene with a great degree of flexibility. The XEEN lens I chose for its quality, latitude and dynamic-range compared to higher-end lens – most of all, it was inexpensive to rent.

#### Q:What type of feel and look you were going for?

A: Initially, the idea of the film was to have an earth tone look, but we ended up with blues and reds to accent the story line. I wanted a warm feel and we achieve that by having a warm filter in front of the lends to give the truest color especially dealing with darker skin tones. The lights used were ambient sunlight and two-Kino Flo (Diva Lite 400) which was brought into push ambient light onto the actors. The idea was to use reflective lighting on the actors faces so it provided a softer and subtle look.

## Q&A WITH BRIAN ISOM (Cont'd)

DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY

#### Q:What were some of the challenges you faced during shooting?

A: The challenges faced were time, the sun, manipulating light and myself. Challenges are sometimes self-inflicted, depending on the individual. I tend not to use excuses as to why I cannot get certain shots or wishing I had more equipment. The idea for me is to put limitations and expectancy on my ability to be creative with the tools I have at any given moment.


## Q: Overall, how do you feel about the project?

A: Overall, I feel great about JANUARY 14TH. I am always learning more to see how I can improve myself from experiences. Again, I can be an overthinker sometimes which drives me through the roof (laughing). What I learned from this process was to trust my own abilities and to remove selfdoubt.

- Jasmine Runnels (Carina) and Tyree Jamar (Michael) hadn't rehearsed together prior to filming and took minimal takes of their scenes.
- Actor **Brian Badolato** says that playing the role of Officer Rodriguez changed him not only as an actor but as a person.
- Actor Tabitha Mitchell (Lisa) said she was secretly hoping that Jasmine would be cast as her sister because of their chemistry at the audition and callback.
